

회화력이 급상승하는 구동사 1

일상 생활 (Daily Life & Routine)

구동사(phrasal verb) - 동사에 전치사나 부사 같은 짧은 단어가 합쳐져서 새로운 뜻을 만드는 표현.

1. wake up 잠에서 깨다

to stop sleeping and become conscious, usually in the morning or after a period of rest

cf) get up (잠에서 깬 후) 일어나다



e.g. I don't feel like waking up this early.

(1/20) I don't feel like V-ing 난 ~할 기분이 아니야.

2. put on 입다

to place clothes, shoes, accessories, or similar items on your body; to apply something like makeup, lotion, or perfume

cf) take off 벗다



e.g. All you need to do is put on a jacket.

(1/2) All you need to do is V 년 ~하기만 하면 돼.

3. **turn on** 켜다

to activate or start a device, machine, or electrical appliance by pressing a button or switch

cf) **turn off** 끄다

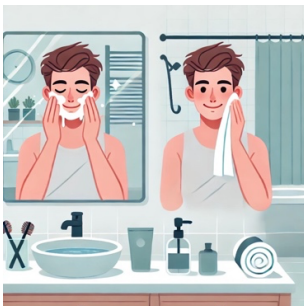


e.g. All I can do is **turn on** the light and wait.

(1/3) All I can do is V 내가 할 수 있는 건 ~뿐이야.

4. **freshen up** 몸단장을 하다

to quickly clean or groom yourself, especially by washing your face, brushing your teeth, or changing clothes



e.g. I feel like **freshening up** before dinner.

(1/24) I feel like V-ing 난 ~하고 싶어.

5. doze off 꾸벅꾸벅 졸다

to fall asleep for a short period, especially unintentionally or when you are not supposed to sleep.



e.g. I ended up dozing off during the meeting.

(1/21) I ended up V-ing 난 결국 ~하고 말았어.

6. slip on ~을 (빠르게) 걸치다, 입다, 신다

to quickly put on clothes, shoes, or accessories in an easy and effortless way



e.g. I didn't have to slip on a jacket because it was so warm outside.

(1/18) didn't have to-V ~할 필요가 없었다

7. kick off (행사 등을) 시작하다

to begin an event, activity, or process, especially in an energetic or official way



e.g. I'm glad we finally kicked off the project.

(1/8) I'm glad ~ 난 ~라서 기뻐.

8. tidy up 깔끔하게 정리하다

to make a space or things neat and organised, usually by arranging items properly

cf) clean up 청소하다



e.g. Do you mind if I tidy up a bit before we start?

(1/19) Do you mind if I V? 내가 ~해도 될까?

9. head out ~로 출발하다, 향하다

to leave a place, usually to go somewhere else, especially for a specific purpose



e.g. Are you trying to say that we need to head out for the airport right now?

(1/5) Are you trying to say (that) ~? 너 지금 ~라고 말하려는 거야?

10. run out of ~을 다 써버리다, 떨어지다

to use all of something so that there is none left.



e.g. Are you saying that my phone has run out of battery?

(1/4) Are you saying (that) ~? 넌[네 말인즉슨] ~라는 말이야?
