

회화력이 급상승하는 구동사 6

업무 & 책임 (Work & Responsibilities)

1. **hand in 제출하다** – 문서를 직접 사람에게 건네는 뉘앙스.

반면에 **submit** 도 '제출하다'이지만 격식체로서 시스템에 업로드하거나 기관에 제출하는 등의 상황에서 쓰임.

to give a document directly to the person in charge



e.g. Should I **hand in** my resume in person?

(6/27) Should I V? 내가 ~해야 할까?

2. **carry on (하던 일을) 계속하다**

to continue doing something, especially after a pause or difficulty



e.g. Maybe you should **carry on** without waiting for him.

(6/20) Maybe you should V 년 ~해야만 할 것 같아.

3. **take on (일, 책임 등을) 맡다** – ‘새로운’ 일, 책임 등을 ‘자발적’으로 맡는 뉘앙스
to willingly accept work or responsibility, especially something new



e.g. Who's going to **take on** the leadership role this time?
(6/23) Who's going to-V? 누가 ~할래?

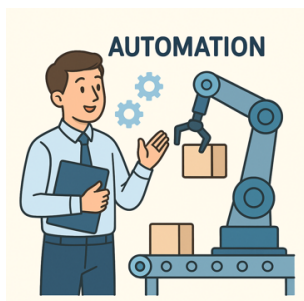
4. **take over (기존의 일, 권한 등을) 인수하다** – ‘기존의’ 일, 권한 등을 이어받는 뉘앙스
to begin to have control or responsibility for something



e.g. I should have **taken over** the project earlier.
(6/29) I should have p.p. 내가 ~했어야 했는데.

5. bring in 도입하다

to introduce something new such as a law, rule, or system



e.g. Rumour has it that the company will bring in a new system.

(6/11) Rumour has it that ~ 소문에 의하면 ~이라고 해.

6. deal with 처리하다, 다루다

to do something in order to solve a problem, or to handle a particular topic



e.g. What am I supposed to deal with first?

(6/18) What am I supposed to-V? 내가 뭘 ~해야 하는 거야?

7. **put off 미루다, 연기하다** – put off 는 구어체에서 많이 쓰고, 공식일정 연기 등 격식체로는 postpone 을 많이 씀
to delay doing something until a later time



e.g. You'd better not **put off** the deadline again.
(6/4) You'd better not V **넌 ~하지 않는 게 좋겠어.**

8. **step in 개입하다, 나서다**

to become involved in a situation in order to help or stop something



e.g. I'm pretty sure the manager will **step in** soon.
(6/15) I'm pretty sure (that) ~ **난 ~라고 꽤 확신해.**

9. **stick to** 고수하다, (어려움이 있어도) 계속하다

to continue doing or using something and not change it, even when it is difficult



e.g. Shouldn't you be sticking to the plan right now?

(6/28) Shouldn't you be V-ing? 너 ~해야 되는 거 아냐?

10. **follow up** 후속 조치를 하다

to do something more to deal with or complete something that was done before



e.g. I just wanted to thank you for following up so quickly.

(6/12) I just wanted to thank you for N/V-ing ~에 감사하고 싶었어.
